- I. Rules Violation
 - Coach Pam Gunn competed two gymnasts who were academically ineligible. Upon discovering her mistake, she self-reported the rules violation to her Principal, Athletic Director, Regional Chair and President of the THSGCA.

- Minimum Penalties stated (Forfeit the competition, remove scores, remove awards and make the other teams (who were in the competition) aware of what happened
- Coach will Inform Principal and Athletic Director and they handle it locally at that time

GYMNASTICS AND THE UIL

The addition of gymnastics as a UIL sport will be placed on a survey of all of the superintendent's in Class 5A and 6A. The superintendents will be asked whether they wish to have gymnastics added as a UIL sport. It's important that we standardize our talking points and try to reach as many superintendents around the state as we can.

The most critical point to be made is regarding the safety of our gymnasts. This is always the primary concern. **Gymnastics should be a UIL sport to mandate that all safety protocols and coaches trainings are followed** as they would be in any other sport.

Adding gymnastics as a UIL sport would **mandate that all aspects of gymnastics follow all UIL rules and policies**.

The goal is not to add additional programs but to validate our current programs most of which have taxpayer build facilities on campus and to protect students that currently enjoy Varsity status.

We wish to ensure the longevity of the current programs that provide a unique opportunity normally outside the reach of most students.

Gymnastics is the number one Olympic spectator sport. Texas fields the highest number of Olympic gymnasts and has the highest number of participants of any state. The Texas High School Gymnastics Coaches Association has been around for 51 years the same length of time as the Super Bowl. They have managed with financial stability to run the State Championships and field the strongest High School gymnastics program in the country.
